Application strategy

Most applicants will have a really varied range of chances across different universities – it's important to understand that this is normal!

To put this in context remember that most medical schools have at least 10 applicants for each place. Therefore a chance of 10% or more represents an above-average chance of admission at most medical schools. Particularly strong applicants will have around a 40% chance of admission, while anything over 50% represents an excellent applicant with an excellent fit to the medical school's selection criteria.

It's important that you think carefully about how to spend your application slots. In most cases we suggest students split their four choices between two 'aspirational' medical schools where they'd most like to go, and two insurance schools where they've got an excellent chance of getting in. If you are in the fortunate position of having excellent chances of getting into all your favourite schools then congratulations, although it may also be worth spending a single slot on your highest percentage chance as insurance.

However remember that you should only ever select medical schools where you'd be happy to study if they were your only choice. If you'd rather reapply than study at a particular school then you'll be better off spending an application somewhere else, no matter how great your chances of getting into the first school.



Please also remember that even the strongest applicants will have a range of schools where they have a low chance of admission: this doesn't necessarily reflect on them as an applicant but simply shows that their particular strengths don't match the selection criteria at those schools.

Universities

Here are all your chances of getting into every medical school. You'll find your chances, why they are what they are and how to improve them.



Introduction

One of the UK's ancient universities, Aberdeen was founded in 1495. A sciences heavy university (with over half the students reading either medicine, science or engineering), Aberdeen nonetheless has a strong reputation for arts and humanities, with a particular and longstanding reputation for Theology.

Aberdeen was recently named Scottish University of the year by the Times' Good University Guide and usually comes in the world's top 200. The university guarantees accommodation for all first-year undergraduates and has recently spent £20m on new accommodation. With a population of around 200,000 the city is popular with those students who do not wish to live in a large metropolis.

The course

Aberdeen is a city university that provides an integrated course, meaning you'll have patient contact from a very early stage. It is also casebased, so you'll study different facets of medicine associated with a single case – for example the physiology, pharmacology and biochemistry of the lung around a respiratory case.

Intercalation is offered in various medical sciences or medical humanities as part of the course, which would lead to an additional degree.

As you have already taken your UCAT, the most useful thing to do would be to improve your predicted grades and practice for interview, since they weigh performance in interview so highly. Improving your predicted A to an A* would increase your chances by around 8 percent.

Birmingham base their interview decisions heavily on your GCSE grades, so there is a limit to how much you can improve your chances. Although your UCAT is very good, it is your overall performance in your GCSEs that limits your chances.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

The algorithm which they use to evaluate GCSE grades do not work in your favour, and there isn't much you can do about it. You should be focusing on interview preparation as about a quarter of the applicants are eliminated at this stage. It is also important that you don't let your school-work slip and meet any offer you may get.

A long-established Russell Group university set in the extensive Edgbaston campus. Its medicine course is integrated, with problem-based learning [PBL]. Limited patient contact in the first two years, increasing as clinical training becomes hospital-based later.

Introduction

Birmingham is home to one of the leading UK universities, which also falls in the global top 100. With an international student body encompassing over 150 countries, it is perfect for anyone seeking a multicultural university experience in the heart of England. It has almost 70 faculties, boasting a wide variety of degrees at various levels, so applicants can be sure to find a course that they enjoy at this institute.

As the first Russell group university to establish a campus in Dubai, Birmingham University can also offer the experience of studying abroad either for the duration of an entire degree or just a year (depending on degree subject).

The course

Birmingham delivers an integrated course with problem-based learning used throughout, at its Edgbaston campus and its associated University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust. Patient contact is limited to 8 days in each of the first two years. From the third year onwards, however, teaching is hospital-based. Problembased learning is used throughout.

Intercalations are available on a widening range of laboratory or community researchbased medical science, policy and management subjects.



Brighton Sussex

The Brighton and Sussex Medical School is a partnership between the Universities of Brighton and Sussex. The University of Brighton has three campuses (plus one in Eastbourne). The entire combined university facilities are within a 20-minute cycle ride of each other and the city centre, and an hour's train journey from London.

Medical school students are members of both students' unions, and can join societies at either. Alumni from these two universities range from Frankie Boyle to A.C. Grayling and Rachel Whiteread.

The course

Brighton and Sussex provides a highly integrated course, with significant patient contact and clinical content forming the basis of its systemsbased modules. Full-body dissection forms part of the anatomy study and is very popular.

All students carry out an individual research project in year 4, and intercalation is an option for those who wish to pursue a further researchbased degree across a wide range of medical science and related subjects.

WHY THIS IS

Your performance in the BMAT is the main factor in determining whether you get an interview here. Thus, your mock BMAT score is the main reason why your chances aren't higher.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

Your chances would improve by 18 percent if you outperform your BMAT mock score by two across all the sections. The BMAT is the most important part of the admissions process, so you should focus on preparing for it.

Summary

Located in the lively south coast town of Brighton, Brighton Sussex's highly integrated course provides early patient contact and includes full-body dissection, with a research project for all plus intercalation as an option.

The course

An integrated course delivered at Bristol's city university facilities and at hospitals in the city and across the region. Although there is early clinical exposure, it is limited in the first two years, before increasing significantly in years 3 to 5.

All students will do at least one research project, but intercalated degrees in either medical science or humanities subjects are available after the third year.



Cambridge University

The course

Cambridge teaches a traditional course, with a clear divide between pre-clinical medical science studies and subsequent clinical training. Oxbridge tutorial teaching is adopted within the various colleges, alongside collective academic study, lectures and related teaching for the entire intake.

There is mandatory intercalation in the third year – with a wide range of degree subjects, extending beyond the strict medical sciences.

WHY THIS IS

Cambridge have a complex selection process, and every area of your academic performance has an effect on your odds. While academic performance has the greatest bearing on chances, being a home student and how Cambridge take into account mitigating circumstances have helped your chances.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

A better BMAT score will also boost your chances. If you can target this, then getting those improved grades in your summer exams will be much more useful than a better personal statement. Achieving four predicted A*s as opposed to three would double your chances

Summary

An ancient university held in high regard globally. Cambridge teaches a traditional medicine course via small-group collegebased supervisions and university-wide departmental teaching. Intercalation is mandatory, in either medical sciences or other disciplines.

Cardiff's Cathays campus is in the heart of Wales' vibrant capital, with the University Hospital a mile and a half to the north. The integrated course has a spiral curriculum, with gradually increasing clinical exposure throughout.

Introduction

Cardiff University is located in the heart of the thriving capital of Wales, which is also the UK's most affordable city according to the NatWest student living index. Cardiff is a compact city so students can travel easily and quickly between campus and accommodation.

The city also has a very young demographic which is why it's known for its nightlife. The students' union here also offers more than 60 different sports clubs and various other societies with which to get involved. Academically, students can create their own programme thanks to their flexible module structure meaning modules can be chosen from more than one department.

The course

Cardiff delivers a spiral curriculum and casebased learning, with the same topics re visited in greater depth throughout the course. Patient contact increases from a day per week initially to full integration in clinical teams by year 5. Teaching is split between Cardiff's University Hospital and the central Cathays Campus, with placements at various regional hospitals and practices.

Intercalation in medical-related sciences is a limited option after year 3.



Dundee University

Introduction

Overlooking the Tay estuary in Scotland, the University of Dundee was originally a part of the University of St. Andrews. Since it became independent in 1967, the university has certainly made a name for itself, ranking 3rd in Scotland and 24th in the UK in the 2020 Times and Sunday Times Good University Guide.

The city itself, while not one of the most famous in the UK, can punch above its weight, with plenty of nightlife, food, green spaces, and cultural attractions including the V&A Dundee Museum of Design. It's no wonder GQ Magazine described Dundee as "Britain's coolest little city", which ensures a great student experience.

The course

A spiral curriculum is used to deliver a fairly traditional course structure at the medical school within the Ninewells Hospital complex. Both problem-based learning and clinical simulation training are used extensively. Fullbody dissection is also a feature not available at all medical schools.

Intercalation is offered, with a wide range of laboratory- and study-based options in areas including medical science, forensic medicine, genetics, health and education.



University of East Anglia

All this is delivered on a single, multi-million pound 320-acre campus that provides excellent sporting facilities, a grade II listed centre for visual arts, and distinctive ziggurat-shaped accommodation blocks alongside academic departments that means internal commuting is never a hassle.

The course

This integrated course is taught at the medical school on the UEA campus and at the immediately adjacent University Hospital. Considerable use is made of problem-based and systems-based learning, with early clinical exposure and frequent patient contact. Dissection is also used within the study of anatomy.

A wide range of intercalations are available with examples ranging from medical science to clinical education and health economics.

WHY THIS IS

Based on the similarity of your profile to those of previous successful candidates, the factor that influences your chances most is your UCAT score. Beyond that, your interview performance is a further major factor in the calculation of your chances of success.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

As you have already taken the UCAT, the main thing you should focus on is preparing for interview. In addition, you could also work on fine-tuning your personal statement.

Following intercalation, clinical teaching is centred on the School of Medicine at the Royal Infirmary and at other hospitals and practices in Edinburgh and beyond.

Research-based intercalation takes place in year 3, across a wide range of medical sciences and related subjects.

WHY THIS IS

While Edinburgh have recently started interviewing their candidates, they still care a great deal about your grades at GCSE, A-levels and the UCAT. Your chances are good because you rank highly for academic performance.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

Your odds would go up if you were to improve your A-Level grades beyond your current projection, but not by more than 5 percent. As you have already sat UCAT, make sure you do plenty of interview preparation, but don't worry too much about your personal statement. Such preparation would also help to increase your chances at other universities.

Summary

Scotland's energetic capital, home to the International Festival and the Fringe, holds the ancient university close to its centre. The medicine course is traditional, has a strong research focus and contains a mandatory intercalation.

Exeter provides an integrated course with a strong emphasis on early and continuing clinical exposure as well as problem-based learning throughout. The first year is taught mainly at the St. Luke's campus, with subsequent years increasingly centred on Trust Hospitals and medical practices across Devon, Cornwall and the South-West.

Intercalation is an option after year 4, across a range of medical sciences plus medical humanities.

WHY THIS IS

Exeter's decision-making process places a strong emphasis on post-16 qualifications grades, and these have a significant influence on your chances. They tend to only use UCAT scores in the case of borderline decisions, so your UCAT performance doesn't have much of an effect on your chances.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

Fewer than half of the interview candidates at Exeter are given an offer, meaning that good preparation is crucial. Such preparation would also help to increase your chances at other universities.

Teaching is at the Wolfson Medical School in the main university and the Queen's University Hospital, with placements in year 3 and beyond at hospitals and practices across the west of Scotland.

Intercalations are available across a range of 20 science options.

The course

The first two years of this integrated course is taught at both the Hull and York university campuses. Problem-based learning is utilised, and clinical skills sessions are supplemented by clinical placements. Clinical studies in years 3 to 5 take place at hospitals and practices across the region.

A 'Scholarship and Special Interest Programme' allows deeper study of areas of particular interest, including dissection, and intercalations in medical sciences are possible.



Imperial College

Aided by their unique "professional development" programme and surrounded by over 100 of Europe's 500 largest companies, students at Imperial are able to benefit from some of the best job market opportunities after graduating.

The university offers generous bursaries of up to £5,000 per annum to students who demonstrate outstanding talent, but who have low household income, thus providing opportunities to those from less affluent backgrounds.

The course

Imperial College School of Medicine places a strong emphasis on science and research in a traditional course that utilises a spiral curriculum. Problem-based learning and casebased teaching provide a clinical focus that supplements the science base. Clinical studies are conducted at hospitals and practices across north and west London.

A medical or science-based intercalation that includes a research project, is built into the course structure.



King's College London

Keele University is on a single campus set in hundreds of acres of beautiful woodland and parks. Many of the facilities, including the medical school, are ultra-modern. Students live in one of its five halls of residence and are guaranteed accommodation if Keele is their first choice.

The intellectual ethos of the university is one of interdisciplinary and multi-disciplinary scholarship. Keele has a particularly strong focus on helping international students settle in and many programmes are dedicated to this purpose. This has, in part, resulted in the Times ranking Keele in the top 5 for student communities.

The course

Keele offers an integrated course that utilises frequent problem-based learning within a spiral curriculum. Studies are split between the main university campus and the nearby University Hospital, with clinical placements also at several other associate hospitals and at practices across the region.

Intercalation for a taught or research-based B.Sc. is an option after year 2, with a Master's degree an alternative after year 4.

WHY THIS IS

Keele has an unusually strong emphasis on their Roles and Responsibilities form, and this has been the dominant factor in determining your chances. They have a hard threshold for your UCAT score, and your performance should be strong enough to pass their filter.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

Since there is such emphasis on the Roles and Responsibilities form, you should maximise your work experience and volunteering and consider how to emphasise it within your submission. Interview performance is also very important, with about half of the candidates eliminated at that stage. Unfortunately, your 20 hours of volunteering is significantly below average and harming your chances.

Summary

A woodland campus is home to the intensely modern Keele University, which has a strong community ethos and excellent support for international students. The integrated medicine course is delivered between the campus medical school and nearby University Hospital.



Lancaster University

WHY THIS IS

Based on your profile, your performance in the BMAT will almost certainly determine whether you get an interview at Lancaster. While there is inherent uncertainty in your interview performance, a strong showing at Lancaster's MMIs could be crucial.

Having attained seventh place in the Guardian UK University Guide in 2020, Lancaster University is currently ranked within the top ten of all three national league tables. A plethora of further statistics show how Lancaster has recently entrenched itself in the top tier of UK universities: International University of the Year by The Times and The Sunday Times Good University Guide 2020 and 3rd in the UK for graduate-level employment, the list goes on.

Of course, facts and figures aren't everything; the collegiate system that enables students to choose a college with its own identity and community provides a starting point for socialising and becoming involved in university life.

The course

This integrated course is delivered encompassing problem-based learning throughout, provides early patient contact, and places significant emphasis on GP and community placements and practice. Teaching is predominantly at the main campus medical school during year 1, and via clinical placements at the Royal Lancaster Infirmary and a number of other hospitals and primary care practices in years 2 to 5. Intercalation is an option after year 4.



Leeds University

Introduction

Leeds University is based on a 98-acre campus and is just one mile away from Leeds city-centre. It is the fifth-largest in the UK with just over 35,000 students, yet has a reputation for having a strong community. It has an impressive track record in graduate employability and counts six Nobel Laureates among its alumni.

The university has committed £520 million to expansion and refurbishment to revitalize its campus and upgrade its academic, student accommodation and ancillary facilities. It already boasts many sports and entertainment facilities including a fitness centre called "The Edge" and a contemporary performance space called "stage@ leeds".

The course

Leeds University Medical School is adjacent to the Leeds General Infirmary and also close to other university facilities. A systems-based and integrated course is delivered that offers early patient contact, full body dissection and a range of intercalation options after years 2, 3 or 4.

Clinical training placements at the Infirmary and other acute and general hospitals in the area, plus GP and community practices increase in later years.



Leicester University

The campus is compact, with all teaching buildings within a few minutes' walk, and represents a century of architectural styles. The university is in the heart of the city of Leicester which, with a population of 300,000, has plenty of entertainment to offer a student.

The course

Leicester's patient-focussed integrated course utilises systems-based teaching, with particular emphasis during the first two years. The Medical School has modern simulation, skills training and full-body dissection facilities. More extensive clinical training placements at several acute and general hospitals and practices in the region take place mainly in years 3 to 5.



Liverpool University

Introduction

The second oldest of the current "red-brick" universities and ranked among the top 200 hundred universities globally, the University of Liverpool embodies the pioneering nature of its city. Prospects are also decent after graduating, with 96.9% of the UK undergraduates in employment or further study six months after graduation, according to the Destination of Leavers from Higher Education survey of 2016/2017.

Liverpool delivers its course via integrated systems-based learning within a spiral curriculum. Early years are focussed on basic and clinical sciences, and clinical skills, predominantly at the university campus. Years 3 to 5 increase clinical exposure in surgery and medicine at a number of hospitals and GP and community practices in Liverpool and the North-West.

Intercalation is possible after year 3, with a range of medicine-related science among the options.

WHY THIS IS

Your UCAT score is proving to be the dominant factor in calculating your chances at Liverpool. Since you meet sufficient criteria that you should get an interview, how you do on the day will then be crucial.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

As you have already sat the UCAT, your priority should be preparing for interview and, if possible, aim to achieve better than predicted A-level grades.

Summary

Liverpool is a city renowned for its history and vibrant, cosmopolitan atmosphere, and the university is one of the oldest "red-bricks". Its medical school delivers and integrated, spiral curriculum, with science-based intercalations an option.



Manchester University

It has the funding to match too, with one of the largest endowments and incomes of any UK university.

In terms of student life, Manchester is vibrant and dynamic, with its campus located near a city centre that rivals London in liveliness and diversity, while its alumni, ranging from Benedict Cumberbatch to Brian Cox, bear testament to the university's formidable reputation.

The course

This integrated course is underpinned by casebased learning throughout. Years 1 and 2 are based at the main campus although some early clinical exposure is provided, and whole-body dissection is also studied. Clinical training during years 3 to 5 is undertaken at a "base" hospital, as well as other hospitals and care practices in the region.

A range of intercalation options are available after years 2, 3 or 4.

WHY THIS IS

The academic factor which influences your chances the most is your performance in the UCAT. Your chances are also based on how well applicants with similar profiles to yours have performed at interview at Manchester.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

As you have already taken the UCAT, the main thing you should focus on is preparing for interview. In addition, you could also work on fine-tuning your personal statement.

Summary

Manchester University is the second largest in the country, and a Russell Group member, situated in a well-known, modern and exciting city. Its medical school is on the main city campus and provides an integrated course.



Newcastle University

This wider insight and greater flexibility is similar to that of many American universities, but within a 3-year course.

Students benefit from being at the heart of the vibrant culture of the city, with the main campus located only about a mile from the city centre, including the renowned Sage music and arts centre.

The course

Newcastle provides an integrated course founded on case-based learning. During the first 2 years the essentials of medical practice are developed, incorporating early clinical and community experience. Clinical training in years 3 to 5 take place within one of four "base units" that each provide the full range of placements in each of the specialist areas studied.

Intercalation for a B.Sc. after year 2, or a Master's after year 4 are alternative options.



Nottingham University

Introduction

In the top 25 across the UK's major league tables, the University of Nottingham is a member of both the Russell Group and the collaborative, research-intensive Universitas 21 group of leading universities from eighteen different countries. While Nottingham might not be as large as London or Manchester, its status as the 6th best on the QS Best Student Cities ranking 2019 shows it can certainly hold its own.

Those wanting to study further afield are also well catered for, with Nottingham being unique in having international campuses in both Malaysia and China – showcasing the university's global connections.

The course

Nottingham delivers an interesting course that awards an extra BMedSci degree without the need for an intercalation (although you can still intercalate a PhD or Master's if you wish). The course uses case-based learning, includes early clinical placement in primary and secondary care, and also offers full body dissection.

The clinical phase occupies the end of year 3 plus years 4 and 5, with placements at hospitals and practices across Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire.



Oxford University

Introduction

As the UK's oldest university and boasting impressive lists of alumni and academics, the university is a magnet for its world class teaching and research. Its 33 undergraduate colleges deliver the worldrenowned tutorial study/teaching that complements its university-wide academic departments.

With 43% of the student body coming from over 150 countries and territories, Oxford offers both a cosmopolitan and unique student experience. Its colleges also provide the close-knit student community that is the hub of social and sporting life.

The course

A traditional course that is delivered via collegebased tutorial teaching as well as full cohort lectures and small group laboratory work through the first three years, with a mandatory research-based intercalation in medical science.

Although remaining attached to a college, years 4 to 6 provide clinical training based mainly at the John Radcliffe Hospital, as well as other hospitals in the area to cover all required specialist rotations.



Plymouth University

Introduction

One of the larger universities in the UK, Plymouth is the only one of the UK's "new" universities to have a medical school. With its coastal location and naval history, Plymouth has a particularly strong reputation in marine and maritime research.

All undergraduates have accommodation for their first year, in central locations close to the city's many attractions including theatre, marina, surfing, boating and nightlife. Plymouth is one of the cheapest places to study in the UK.

The course

Plymouth's integrated course provides patient interaction from the first few weeks, with supplemental problem-based and clinical casebased learning. Within this context, basic science and core medical knowledge are taught in the first two years. Clinical placements in hospitals and GP practices in Plymouth and the region increase during years 3 to 5, culminating in full involvement in a hospital medical team. A wide range of intercalation options are available.

WHY THIS IS

The factor which has the most influence on your chances of receiving an offer from Plymouth is your performance in the UCAT. The other major factor in the calculation of your odds is how well candidates with profiles similar to yours have performed at interview.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

As you have already taken the UCAT, the main thing you should focus on is preparing for interview. In addition, you could also work on fine-tuning your personal statement.

Summary

Plymouth is a famed naval and maritime city that offers both city and coastal attractions to its students. In its integrated course, the Peninsula Medical School teaches at the main Plymouth campus and at hospitals across the south-west.



Queen Mary's University

It has a strong international reputation with around half of its students coming from overseas. Medicine is one of its renowned and longstanding strengths, and it delivers its medicine-related courses in partnership with Barts and the London School of Medicine and Dentistry.

It is well situated across four campuses in the East End of London, with all the benefits of being in the capital. Queen Mary's also has various programmes allowing students to study in other countries such as China, Greece and Malta.

The course

Also called Bart's and The London, this is one of the oldest medical schools, now offering a modern course with problem-based learning, much of it based on early patient contact and clinical cases. Years 3 and 4 build on basic science and medical knowledge with clinical placements, while year 5 combines further placements with medical school teaching.

Intercalation for both Bachelor and Master's degrees is an option at various stages.



Queen's University Belfast

It is well situated in the student-friendly city of Belfast, and the rest of Northern Ireland can easily be reached. It also has an impressive employment record for its graduates, with consistently well over 90% of its graduates are in employment or further study six months after graduation.

The course

Queen's delivers an integrated course that includes early patient contact and clinical placements, and anatomy teaching includes whole body dissection. Basic science and medicine is taught from a systems perspective, developing medical knowledge before a move into broader clinical training, which increases during years 3 to 5 and takes place in hospitals and primary care across Northern Ireland.

Intercalation options at Bachelor's and Master's degree level are available.



St Andrew's University

One of the world's oldest universities, much favoured by American students, situated in a beautiful Scottish coastal city. The course provides the first three years of science-based teaching only, with subsequent transfer to other universities for clinical training.

Introduction

As the third oldest university in the Englishspeaking world and the oldest of the Scottish universities, St. Andrews certainly lives up to its motto: "Ever to Excel". Ranked second by the 2020 Guardian UK University Guide, and the top Scottish university by the 2020 Complete University Guide, St. Andrews regularly tops league tables. Whilst that might be partially down to the idyllic settings of its eponymous town, the university is far from disconnected with the outside world.

St. Andrews is a favourite of American students, who make up around 1 in 6 of the student population in 2017, not to mention students and staff representing another 140 nationalities.

The course

St Andrew's offers only the first three years of medical training. After graduating with your B.Sc. honours degree, you transfer to Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Queen Mary's or Manchester to complete your training. The course provides the scientific and medical foundation for a medical career, also developing the clinical and communication skills required during subsequent clinical training. A research project is undertaken during the third year.



St George's University

St George's is unique as a College of the University of London in focussing only on medicine. It is attached to St George's Hospital, which is one of London's largest and busiest hospitals. Furthermore, it boasts Advanced Patient Simulators which provide further training opportunities to students. While a specialist medical school, it offers a diverse range of undergraduate courses such as clinical pharmacology, diagnostic radiography and occupational therapy (all B.Sc.).

It is excellently situated in South-West London, with all of the benefits that come from being in the UK's largest city. It also has a strong reputation for research across medical disciplines.

The course

The course at St George's is traditional in that basic medical science is taught during the first two years, followed by a transition into clinical training in year 3 and increasing clinical placements across various specialisms in years 4 and 5. Teaching is based on clinical cases and problem-based learning is used throughout.

An intercalated B.Sc. degree is an option after year 3.



Sheffield University

WHY THIS IS

Sheffield base their interview selection almost exclusively on your UCAT performance. We have also taken into consideration how well you will potentially do at interview in calculating your odds.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

As you have already taken the UCAT, the main thing you should focus on is preparing for interview. In addition, you could also work on fine-tuning your personal statement.

The course

Systems-based teaching, with clinical case examples and dissection, is used during the early years of Sheffield's integrated course, with significant clinical exposure in hospitals and GP practices from the outset. A research project is completed in year 2, and further clinical science teaching transitions into increasing clinical training that predominates in years 3 to 5.

Both research-based and surgery intercalations are available.

Summary

Highly-ranked in the Russell Group and nationally, Sheffield University is close to the city centre, with the medical school at the nearby Royal Hallamshire Hospital. Clinical exposure from the start and dissection are features of its integrated course.

The city, on the south coast, is studentfriendly and only 60 miles from London. The university has an especially strong reputation for engineering and puts strong emphasis on collaboration with industry in the syllabus.

The course

Southampton's integrated course is delivered at its main university campus and the nearby University Hospital. Problem-based learning is a feature of the first two years during which there is also significant clinical exposure and patient contact. A 16-week research project is undertaken in year 3, which also provides the transition into clinical training that takes place predominantly in years 4 and 5.

Intercalation is an option between years 3 and 4.

The course

UCL delivers a traditional course with a strong focus on research and a mandatory intercalated BSc. Dissection is also a feature. Medical and clinical science teaching occupies the first two years at the central London Medical School, followed by the intercalated B.SC degree. The final three years provide the bulk of clinical training in the associated University College Hospital, as well as the Royal Free, Whittington and primary care practices.

WHY THIS IS

For UCL, your performance in the BMAT is proving to be the most important factor in the below average chances of success here. This is despite certain other factors in your profile acting in your favour.

IMPROVE YOUR CHANCES

Make sure you are well-prepared for the BMAT as any improvement in your score will increase your chances. You should also do some practice for your interview. You will need to increase your BMAT score by at least 4 points in total to significantly increase your chances.
